

### Awards Given to Neighborhood Leaders

an Hurley, UMHN President, was recently honored by The Southeast Area Coalition, Inc. at its 41<sup>st</sup> Annual Membership Meeting. Dan received the 2010 Community Builder/Neighborhood Award. This award is well-deserved as Dan puts in countless hours each week attending meetings, sending emails, talking to the media, etc., all for the benefit and improvement of our neighborhood.

The article in **SEAC's Annual Report** read as follows:

"Dan Hurley has lived in and been an enthusiastic advocate for the Upper Mt. Hope Neighborhood for the past 12 years. He is the current President of the Association and has been its most active member since the Association's inception. Dan is loved and known by his neighbors as the go-to-guy whenever there is something that must be accomplished. In fact, many believe that "no" is simply not in Dan's vocabulary. He is a wonderful example of volunteerism and dedication, while at the same time a reliable and outstanding friend and father.

Perhaps no project of Dan's is more visible than the "Project Hope" signs which are presented throughout the UMHN/Strong neighborhood. Starting in 2003, Dan, along with Patrick Fisher, worked with students from the Mary Cariola Children's Center as the students envisioned and created the original artwork. He shared the children's artwork with the late artist, Achille Forgione, who translated it into the templates that formed the functional art that we see today.

Throughout this long process, Dan masterminded the ins and outs of working with City of Rochester officials and members of the Arts Council. The first sign installations began in the Spring of 2004, and were completed in the Summer of 2007. The signs continue to be a bright spot in the neighborhood to this day.

For all his tireless and selfless energy, creativity and leadership, **SEAC** is proud to name **Dan Hurley** as recipient of its **2010 Community Builder/Neighborhood Award.**"
