Upon entering the Genesee Bakery & Deli, I was greeted with much enthusiasm by the owner, David Fiorito. He and his wife Daryl opened the bakery twelve years ago. David, the former technical advisor of new products for Dunkin Doughnuts, explained to me that the Genesee Bakery was originally located on Genesee Street and was in existence for about 50 years.

As a deli, the Fioritos serve hot and cold subs, salads, macaroni & cheese, and stuffed breads. They also roast turkey onsite to make the freshest and best tasting turkey sandwiches.

The owners will also create, at the customer's request, sandwich trays, cookie trays, and pastry/dessert trays.

When asked what sets his bakery apart from others: "Everything that we carry in the store we actually produce here. During the week everyone that works here is family, so you're waited on by one of the owners, and receive extra added personal attention." Dave also says that you get to know everyone on a first name basis and can better cater to customer's needs. In his business, Dave believes that every day is different due to the change of seasons and the various holidays. What he likes most is watching families in the neighborhood grow.
